## New Premises in Ahoghill

## **GP Appointments**

The new arrangements around booking a GP appointment continue. This is being offered at a growing number of practices across Northern Ireland in a bid to improve GP access and continuity of care. It was commenced in Maine Medical in March 2017. Appointments are now booked on the day. Patients who would like a GP appointment first speak with the GP in a telephone consultation. Those who need to be seen are invited in that day. This improves access to your usual GP improving continuity of care, and ensures that any patients with acute or urgent problems are seen in a timely fashion. We continue to monitor the roll-out and listen to any feedback. A review will take place in the autumn. Please let us know if you have encountered any problems you would like us to take into account.

### Minor Ailments

The local pharmacies now run a minor ailment scheme to improve access to medication for common complaints. These are free at chemist without prescription. The scheme covers oral thrush, cold sores, ear wax, mouth ulcers, athlete's foot, diarrhoea, head lice, thread worms and vaginal thrush. Please speak first with your local pharmacist for advice.
